



The Role of Community Corrections in Reform

Under its *current* mandate...

- •Wrong context
 - Need natural settings reflecting unique goals
- •Wrong people
 - Need support-oriented people with excellent interpersonal skills
- •Wrong goals
 - Need a focus on reform, not recidivism



Faulty Assumptions About How Change Occurs

- Offenders are essentially different from all other human groups
- Reducing problems will reduce criminal behavior
- If services are made available, offenders will use them
- Services actually accomplish what they are designed to do




Nature of Change






General Model of Human Growth

Theories of Criminality vs. Theories of Desistance

Criminality

- Deficit-based
- Expert is PO/therapist
- Goal is to reduce criminal behavior

Desistance

- Strengths-based
- Expert is the individual
- Goal is unique to person



Predictable Challenges

- Support from friends and family
- Limited available roles
- Stigma and reduced perceived trustworthiness
