Ladies and Gentlemen

My task here tonight is very simple yet very heavy; I feel very honoured and privileged to stand before this elite gathering to make a remark, yet, I feel burdened what a paradox! This is because I am to give a vote of thanks on behalf of the participants of the 14<sup>th</sup> UNAFEI UNCAC Training Programme. Thank you speech comes only at the end of an event- therefore thank you speech tonight means “SAYONARA”. I hope you do understand my difficulties. I just wish to state in the beginning that we are not making this thank you speech as a mere formality but we

genuinely and deeply wish to express our gratitude to all people and organizations that made this course a success.

We are also thankful to the Deputy Director, Mr. Ukawa, a man of clean and crisp language, and a professional to the core, yet with a voice that can sing my pains away. Therefore, we need to strengthen our ties, cooperation, share information and broaden our knowledge to meet the future challenges we will face. The fight against corruption is definitely not an easy one, but with commitment, determination and collaboration, near zero level corruption can be achieved in our societies!
