**Ladies and gentlemen,**

I am deeply honored to be given the opportunity to make this  
farewell speech on behalf of my fellow participants. Writing a farewell

speech is indeed a daunting task as it touches on issues of disengagement with persons one has had the pleasure to socialize and appreciate one another; as the list is endless. It also brings forth emotions of happiness and sadness in equal measure. Happiness because we are finally going back to our beloved countries and families; sadness because we will be leaving behind new friends with whom we have spent five weeks and bonded to become a new family.

I would like to take this opportunity on behalf of my fellow participants to convey our sincere and profound gratitude to the Government of Japan, JICA, UNAFEI, ACPF and our individual country governments for providing us the opportunity to participate in this vibrant and unique course.

About 40 days ago we were welcomed in Japan. Our bags were packed with uncertainty and apprehension. We were all different people, different cultures, yet expectations were emanating from our pores. We came to fulfill a task of sharing our experiences and discussing future directions regarding

effective *training for correctional leadership*, especially in the fields of understanding international standards and norms in treatment of offenders, organizing training based on effective training methods, enhancing organizational culture of integrity, stress management and promotion of cooperation in capacity building with other organizations.

The 161<sup>st</sup> training involved **14** overseas participants, from different countries and **4** Japanese participants all working in the criminal justice system ranging from the justice departments Police, Prosecution, judiciary, correctional institutions and probation departments. The theme of the training was “*Staff training for correctional leadership*” with focus on effective training methods, understanding and respecting international standards and norms and treatment of difficult offenders.

It is only in the recent past that concerns of a comprehensive curriculum of effective training methodologies for correctional staff; addressing emerging crime trends, has started receiving due attention and has eventually become an area of global concern.

Difficult offenders like terrorists, money launderers, sexual related offenders and human traffickers have unique characteristics and challenges that need to be mitigated through specialized and effective training programmes.

Participants shared their countries' experiences on staff training and in addition to UNAFEI faculty, visiting expert lectures, adhoc lectures, visitation by VPOS (*The back bone Probation work in Japan*). Group discussions and visits to relevant institutions served to enrich the course. Future directions in implementing effective training curriculum and good practices were identified and will serve as guides to implementation of the same in our individual countries.

Ultimately, improvement of training curriculum through development of training manuals, lesson plans, mentorship, OJT and use of international instruments in correction work were identified as measures that would help improve service delivery of correctional staff.

I do believe that the objectives of this course were fully achieved and the participants now bear the responsibility of utilizing the knowledge achieved and establishing networks for the exchange of updated information on the practices of their respective countries.

These objectives would not have been achieved without the diligent organization of the humble Mr. YAMASHITA, **Director** of UNAFEI and his dedicated team of professionals. We congratulate your excellent organizational skills and deeply appreciate your efforts and those of your dedicated, patient and courteous faculty and staff who made our lives at UNAFEI comfortable.
